

J, MAX BOND JR,

In honor of Black History Month, Columbia GSAPP is highlighting the contributions of former Professor **J. Max Bond Jr.** (1935-2009), who began teaching at Columbia GSAPP in 1968 and was the Chair of Architecture from 1980-1984.

Recognized as one of the most influential and prominent African-American architects and educators in the United States, Bond helped establish one of the first community design centers—the Architects Renewal Committee of Harlem (ARCH)—in 1964. His notable projects include Martin Luther King, Jr. Center and Dr. King's entombment; the Schomburg Center in New York; the Studio Museum in Harlem; and the National September 11 Memorial and Museum at the World Trade Center.

The Avery Library houses the J. Max Bond Jr. Papers, 1955-2009, a collection that documents Bond's life and career through his professional activities, academic work, and personal papers. Among the holdings are documents related to *Point*, the journal published by the Minority Student and Faculty Organization during Bond's tenure.

In celebration of his legacy, GSAPP made a leadership gift to support the creation of an endowment for the annual J. Max Bond, Jr. Lecture organized by NOMA, the J. Max Bond Center for Urban Futures at CUNY, and the AIANY Diversity and Inclusion Committee. The most recent lecture, hosted in October 2021, featured **Brian D. Goldstein** (Swarthmore College), **Shawn L. Rickenbacker** (City College of New York), and **Sanjive Vaidya** (New York City College of Technology).
