ORCHID STRING MALE CANCER

AN EVENING OF CELEBRATION AND FUNDRAISING IN SUPPORT OF ORCHID AND CARERS UK



According to Cancer Research UK, 2013, every year over 50,000 men in the UK will be diagnosed with prostate, testicular and penile cancer. Of these men over 47,300 (1 in 8 men of which 1 in 4 will be a black man) will be diagnosed with prostate cancer, over 2,296 will be diagnosed with testicular cancer and 622 will be diagnosed with the rare penile cancer

Orchid is the UK's leading charity working on behalf of anyone affected by or interested in male cancer – prostate, testicular and penile cancer. Orchid exists to save men's lives from male cancer through a range of support services, education and awareness campaigns and a pioneering research programme. Their staff, Trustees, Patrons, Ambassadors and Volunteers all work towards one goal: ensuring they put men at the centre of everything they do.

There are tests and screening which can help minimise the impact of breast and cervical cancer in women but, nothing yet which can provide a similar level of comfort or help to our men. We felt that we must do something to help change the situation by supporting Orchid in raising funds and awareness of a disease that kills one man every hour in the UK. We believe that our men are worth fighting for and are happy to support a charity that supports men and their families affected by prostate, testicular and penile cancers, provides vital information and finds answers by funding research into cause and treatments. ABOUT THE CHARITIES





Orchid exists to save men's lives from testicular, prostate and penile cancers through pioneering research and promoting awareness It is only by talking about male cancer that men and women will be made aware of and notice the signs and symptoms. As with all cancers, early diagnosis can often lead to less complicated treatment and ultimately saves lives.

Orchid works with a range of organisations including Macmillan Cancer Support, CRUK, Teenage Cancer Trust, Target Prostate Cancer, Prostate Cancer UK, British Association of Urological Nurses (BAUN) and with specialist teams such as Penile Cancer Supra-networks.

With twenty years of experience funding research of the highest quality, Orchid has delivered a number of ground-breaking achievements for male cancer patients in the UK and across the globe.

A few of them are:

- The Development of the Orchid Tissue Bank an international resource for cancer research analysis contains the largest collection of penile cancers in a tissue array in Europe. It is now one of the largest testicular tissue banks in the world and is custodian of the most important series of untreated prostate cancers.
- The discovery that the gene ZDHHC14 is often damaged in cases of testicular and prostate cancer.
- The discovery that the risk of testis cancer is increased in people with HIV.

Caring for a loved one can be a very daunting undertaking and having a support network like Carers UK to go to for help and guidance can be such a comfort. People caring for others who are suffering from illness, a disability or trauma are often the forgotten heroes. Raising awareness and fund-raising for this charity has become a passion for Felicia.



Talking to friends and family she discovered that several of the men had or are suffering from prostate cancer. She also found that many of them had never been checked for the disease and encouraged them and others to go to their GPs for regular check-ups. She is pleased to join Medina in her campaign to spread the word to make regular checks available to men.
