ANATOMY OF A GENOCIDE

"the Kreisbauernrat [district chief] of Carlsbad advised as Buczacz Landkommissar" because of his contacts with Jews. It was through him that the "jet to know it was her Kramer" and the chairman Reich, since the one of us ally came to my apartment to negotiate with my husband.
