Charities

Mygoma Orphanage: Founded - 1961, Began under the name of Maternity and Childhood Hospital and supervised by Federal Ministry of Health to care for abandoned children up to 4 years of age. It is located in Khartoum, capital of the Sudan. Most of children admitted to the centre are the result of illegitimate pregnancies. They are mainly abandoned just after birth and brought by the authorities to the centre.

Save the Children - Sudan: Founded - 1984, They conduct programs for children and families affected by conflict, displacement, extreme poverty, hunger and a lack of basic services. Many of the children and families served were among the most vulnerable and hardest to reach.

Volunteers of America: Founded - 1896, They provide services that are designed locally to address specific community needs. Their common areas of focus include promoting self-sufficiency for the homeless and for others overcoming personal crises, caring for the elderly and disabled and fostering their independence, and supporting positive development for troubled and at-risk children and youth.



UNICEF USA - Syrian Refugees: Founded - 1947 UNICEF has been on the ground since the conflict began, helping to mobilize the largest humanitarian operation in history and working closely with partners to provide education, water, health care and immunizations, physical protection, psychological support and clothing to children in Syria and Syrian refugee children in Iraq, Jordan, Turkey, Lebanon, Egypt and Europe.

National Breast Cancer Coalition: Founded - 1991, the National Breast Cancer Coalition's (NBCC) mission is to end breast cancer through the power of action and advocacy. NBCC increases federal funding for breast cancer research, currently more than \$3 billion; monitors how research funds are spent; expands access to quality health care for all; and ensures that trained advocates influence all decision making that affects breast cancer.
