





The Department of Water Supply made the suggestion last week, and preliminary studies are under way. The department pointed out that roofing would protect the water supply and make available space for playing fields.



Holliswood Hall, Proprietor of Scene of Liquor Seizure, Arraigned.

Arraigned before United States Commissioner James H. McCabe, in Brooklyn, yesterday, on a charge of having liquor on his premises in violation of the Volstead act, John E. Tench, proprietor of Holliswood Hall, a roadside hotel at Hollis, L. I., was required to give \$2,500 bail to await the action of the Grand Jury.


