








## **ROOF PLAN**

Assumptions of available roof surfaces




# A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE MANNIE L. WILSON TOWERS

#### SYDENHAM HOSPITAL (1925 - 1980)



- America's first interracial hospital
- First full-service hospital in NYC to hire African-American nurses, doctors, and physicians.
- In 1978, Mayor Ed Koch released a plan to close Sydenham.
- A "Coalition to Save Sydenham" occupied the lobby for 10 days and stressed its importance to the medically underserved black community in New York.





- Pastor, Convent Avenue Baptist Church in Harlem
- President, Council of Churches
- Activist and community leader
- First black clergyman to speak at the White House



# **NEXT STEPS**

# CONTEXTUAL STANDARD QUESTIONS FOR ROOFTOP ADDITIONS (per NYC Landmarks Preservation Commission)

- 1. Is the addition visible at a significant distance?
- 2. Is the addition visible from limited vantage points, through alleyways, yards or similar open portions of sites that are not vacant building sites?
- 3. Is the addition visible from an oblique angle?

#### **NEXT STEPS**

Once finalized, we should determine the heights of any rooftop additions and determine if they will be visible from public thoroughfares (i.e. Manhattan Avenue, 123rd Street, and 124th street).

#### Required Application Materials

- Photos of building facades and roof.
- Photos of areas of construction at the roof.
- Existing and proposed annotated roof plans showing locations where construction will occur.
- Comparative elevations of existing conditions and proposed additions.
- Comparative building section drawings showing existing conditions and proposed additions on the roof, including chimneys, railings, and surrounding parapets:
  - Sightline section taken at 6-foot eye level from directly across the street at the property line and other points where the addition may be visible
- Large-scale detail drawings of visible additions only
- Material specifications on drawings.
- Color specifications for visible additions only.

- Two sets of DOB filing drawings if work requires a DOB permit.
- DOB Objections Sheet or HUB documentation clear of zoning objections.

A physical mock-up of the construction is required to determine potential visibility. The following application materials must be submitted:

- Color photos of the mock-up and roof from surrounding points on the street to document visibility of proposed addition at a 6-foot eye level.
- If the proposed addition is visible from a public thoroughfare, color photos from points of visibility:
  - If staff requests, a photo montage of each view with the addition drawn in.

If LPC requires additional materials after your application is reviewed, you will receive a Materials Checklist from LPC staff.


