Course Syllabus

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Architectural Finishes - A Hands-on Workshop

Wednesdays, 9am-1pm, Spring 2018 Mary Jablonski

The Finishes Workshop provides students with skills to survey, identify and produce a conditions report on architectural finishes. We will also learn how to research and select treatments for these finishes which we will then execute in the field. The field work in this course will help prepare you for professional work in the field of preservation whether you are a designer, administrator, conservator or preservationist.

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There are no pre-requirements for this workshop, only your curiosity about the historic building materials at the South Street Seaport Museum. The majority of class time will be spent in the field learning how to examine buildings and their finishes. There will also be lectures, readings, and some laboratory work.

The preserved buildings in the South Street Seaport neighborhood are meant to transport the visitor back to New York's mid-19th century, to demonstrate what life in the commercial seaport was like. At the seaport was a hotel built in 1868 at the corner of Fulton and South Streets. Inside the museum are the remnants of this hotel. It is these fragments of rooms that we will be focusing on in our class. The finishes in the hotel rooms help tell the hidden stories of the people who once inhabited these rooms and our role is to ensure these stories are not lost.

The individual houses on Schermerhorn Row were designated <u>New York City Landmarks (Links to an external site.)Links to an external site.</u> in 1968, and the block was collectively added to the <u>National</u> <u>Register of Historic Places (Links to an external site.)Links to an external site.</u> in 1971.
