
- Diagonal condition allows for the greatest sunlight exposure
- Highest point offers panoramic views of the city and Tompkin's Square Park.



- Raised back allows for staggered floor plates: students enter from 9th Street directly into the lobby whereas staff have entrances from 10th Street of their own.




- All classroom programs are set in the existing side bars of the H plan.
- The central bar invites every student to meet in shared central spaces.











Basement Plan (-3.00ft)


Ground Floor Plan (+12.75)


Second Floor Plan (+28.50ft)








Fifth Floor Plan (+75.75)
