ABOUT PROJECT BLACKBIRD & LIVE TOURING EVENT

PROJECT BLACKBIRD is a 501(c)3 organization that works to de-stigmatize eating disorders and mental health conversation within underrepresented communities.

PROJECT BLACKBIRD's cornerstone program is a live touring event that encourages conversations around the crises and stigma related to mental illness and eating disorders within underrepresented communities internationally. The touring event features a screening of the award-winning short film BLACKBIRD, a clinician-based journaling exercise, and a celebrity panel discussion featuring NFL, NBA, film, music, and industry mental health advocates alongside Project Blackbird founder Alexandra Miles. Each event also provides participants with local, national, and campus resources to begin the journey toward recovery and self-acceptance. Recent events include panels at the Sundance Film Festival, South by Southwest (SXSW), and the Cannes Film Festival.

New this year, PROJECT BLACKBIRD is grateful to fund free therapy for 700 students participating in our tour with our partners at **Talkspace**. We are honored to encourage and empower participants to confront mental health struggles in their lives that may be causing them shame to give those situations less power.

YOUNG ADULT MENTAL HEALTH EVENTS

Focusing on young adult mental health at the collegiate and high school levels is where PROJECT BLACKBIRD's mission began, and these events make up half our annual tour.

This panel features Alexandra (Founder of PROJECT BLACKBIRD), Kendra ("the original Blackbird" whose story is depicted in the short film Blackbird), and a celebrity panelist who is a draw for students in that particular market/region/school. The conversation focuses generally on mental health, how to shed shame around mental issues or struggles they may be facing, and encourage attendees to take advantage of PROJECT BLACKBIRD's official partnership with Talkspace to offer complimentary therapy to young adults who participate in our program.

ATHLETE-FOCUSED EVENTS

One of PROJECT BLACKBIRD's event formats is tailored to collegiate student-athletes, which includes a panel discussion featuring a sports star from the NFL or NBA. We have partnerships with both the NFL Players' Association and the NBA Players' Association, with additional partnerships in development. These events help student-athletes understand that they are not the only ones dealing with the unique situation of balancing their studies with practices, games, and the toll that can take on their mental health.

For example, our outstanding panel featuring Corey Coleman (Kansas City Chiefs Wide Receiver), Dominique Easley (Super Bowl XLIX Champion), and NFL Veteran Marcus Smith II, passionately delved into NFL and Athlete perspectives on mental health, sparking meaningful conversations and striving to normalize conversation everywhere.











EATING DISORDER-FOCUSED EVENTS

With event formats directly addressing and focusing on Eating Disorders, PROJECT BLACKBIRD also debunks myths, addresses the signs and struggles of an eating disorder, creates conversations around discrepancies in treatment and awareness, and provides guidance on how to support those in need. We shed light on the various struggles that might lead to eating disorder behaviors and/or an eating disorder diagnosis, and tailor the resource fair to specific eating disorder resources. General mental health providers and resources are also present, but this event highlights the eating disorder topic more specifically.

Examples of this format include professional organizations and journals around mental health, and we have brought this topic in as a hybrid at film festivals to ensure advocacy within the entertainment industry.

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FILM + SOCIAL IMPACT EVENTS

PROJECT BLACKBIRD events at film festivals and accompanying impact lounges open with the full, 13-minute film Blackbird, but unlike other events, the panel discusses how film and media is a powerful tool to address social issues and educate the public. The panel includes actors and filmmakers with a conversation is intentionally crafted around mental health in narrative filmmaking and diverse representation. This is followed by a networking event involving gifts from like-minded health and wellness brands to enhance mental and physical health and connection at film festivals.

PROJECT BLACKBIRD has been presented at Sundance, Cannes Film Festival, SxSW, TIFF (Toronto International Film Festival), and Festival of Cinema New York City 2024.
