


# Tang Project Inspired by Amy Wu and the Patchwork Dragon written by Kat Zhang

Create your Own Unique Dragon!

Materials: paper, markers, scrap papers, glue, scissors, anything else you have on hand!


Steps:

1. Think about a dragon that you want to create. It can be any shape, size, or color that you can think of! Do you want your dragon to fly? Have scales? Have big teeth? It's up to you!



2. Draw an outline of your dragon. You can add horns, a tail, wings, or any other features you can think of.

3. Add details to your dragon by using different colors and shapes. For this example, we used different colored markers to make feathers on the body of the dragon.




4. Continue decorating your dragon by adding different materials such as colorful paper, sequins, tissue paper, or any other materials you can find. Here, we glued colored tissue paper to the body of the dragon.

5. Enjoy expressing yourself through your dragon! Think about where it might live, what it might eat, or any powers it might have.
