HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH



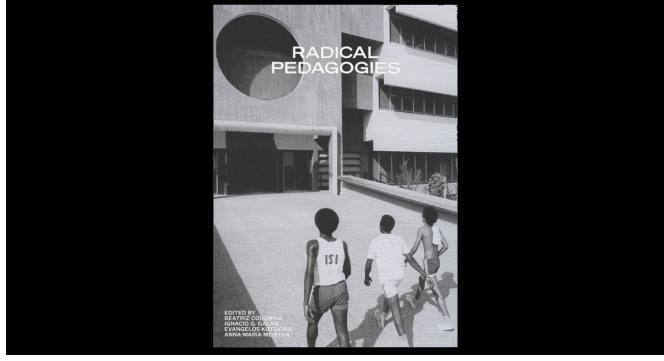

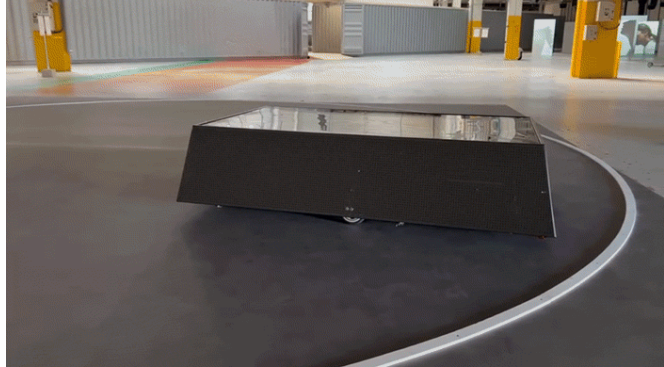
