## ABOUT THE FOUNDER

Asadah Kirkland, author of the book Beating Black Kids and Founder of the Soulful Chicago Book Fair has been a part of the literary industry for over 20 years. Her literary journey began as the manager of the Afrocentric Bookstore in downtown Chicago, back in 1994. In 1999, Asadah began the development of what would be Harlem, New York's only literary cafè at the time, Read My Mind Literary Cafè. She developed her own language arts cirricula for the Boys and Girls Harbor afterschool program from 2001 to 2008. And in 2008 she also helped edit, market and produce the book Align With the Divine, by Lady Prema.

In 2009 Asadah wrote her own book, Beating Black Kids, forging a crusade to end corporal punishment in America - starting with the Black community. Asadah has become the go-to person on the subject, having appeared on CNN, Inside Story Al Jazeera, WABC-TV's "Here and Now," Essence.com, the Amsterdam News and New York Parenting Magazine, amongst many others. Asadah has returned to Chicago with the sum total of her literary expertise, bringing to life for its second year, the Soulful Chicago Book Fair, July 16, 2017.

## **VISITOR PROFILE**

The Soulful Chicago Book Fair attracts patrons that reflect a myriad ages and ethnicities. The main commonality is their interest in storytelling, education and the performing arts. The event's primary draw is middle-income African-Americans between the ages of 25 and 65, who are book enthusiasts that purchase books for the entire family.




## **AUTHOR SUBMISSION**

An important feature of the book fair is the author submission process. Rather than following the traditional process of accepting money with no review of content, the SCBF is opening vendorship to authors with content that matches and supports the family climate of the book fair.

Applications are reviewed by our panel of judges to curate the right mixture of categories to offer the visiting public.

## THE FESTIVAL

The Soulful Chicago Book Fair is a celebration of literacy and the literary arts found throughout the African Diaspora. It is Chicago's premiere "author-centric" festival, filled with stories told through books, spoken word, songwriting, playwriting and art. Patrons can expect an experience replete with over 100 Black authors, publishers and literary organizations, organized by genre, over a span of 4 blocks.



## LOCATION

The festival runs in the heart of Chicago's south side in the Woodlawn community, between two of the neighborhood's main thoroughfares Cottage Grove and King Drive. Woodlawn bisects the south side and cradles much of the University of Chicago's healthcare system and student housing.

# **FESTIVAL FEATURES**

## WRITERS

The Soulful Chicago Book Fair provides an opportunity for over 100 Black writers to participate. Experienced and novice writers are welcome to apply. Each exhibitor receives:

- + 10 X 10 Tent | One 6 ft. table | Two chairs
- + (optional) 30 45 second promo video announcement per participating author
- + Weekly Social media and website promotion
- + Blocks organized by genre
- + Access to thousands of readers



## **ENTERTAINMENT**

We express the power of our words and stories through many art forms. In 2016, the Soulful Chicago Book Fair showcased our stories to visitors in a fusion unlike any combination of entertainment ever seen in one location before! The event offered entertainment on its main stage and offered an open mic to the community on its smaller "St. Lawrence Stage." Children and adults alike enjoyed puppet shows on the small stage by Kazoom Kids Publishing, while members of Black Lives Matter got to share works from their #OurStoryChi storytelling series. The book fair's 2016, main stage musical line-up included two time Grammy-nominated, neo-soul artist Eric Roberson, soulful house music by DJ Duane Powell, the Hip-hop Jazz stylings of Maggie Brown, ancestral jazz by David Boykin, sultry R&B vocalist J. Daphaney and Ballroom Rock by Blah Blah Blah. Its theater presentations featured a rendition of the novel, the Middle Passage, by Charles Johnson, performed by the Pegasus Theatre Troupe, as well as the high energy, social activist voices of KUUMBA LYNX, an Intergenerational Spoken Word Ensemble.

## **WORKSHOPS & OTHER ACTIVITIES**

## **Author Commercials**

The Soulful Chicago Book fair shot commercials of its authors to promote them to book lovers during the months leading up to the main event. The promotional videos were highlighted on the event website, on Youtube and throughout all of our social media circles. These videos helped to increase awareness of the authors and the plots of their books to prep patrons before visiting the main event.



## **Great Migration Procession**

It is tradition in many African cultures, to pay homage to elders and request their permission before speaking. In that tradition, the Soulful Chicago Book Fair officially starts its festivities after a beautiful procession of drummers and elders make their way atop a float, up the 61st street corridor toward the main stage. Once the main stage is reached, the elders are asked for permission to begin the event. The 2016 Elder Commemoration float was dedicated to the Centennial year of the Great Migration and included elder authors, high school friends, and participants over 90 years of age.

## The Soulful Chicago KWANZAA Book Fair

Authors and patrons thoroughly enjoyed the main event in the summer and continuously request more opportunities to do more of the same throughout the year. Thus evolved the Soulful Chicago KWANZAA Book Fair, lending access to Black literary creativity for the holiday season and supporting the true educational spirit that KWANZAA was designed to create.





## TIMUEL D. BLACK ESSAY CONTEST



Dr. Timuel D. Black is a revered educator, political and social activist, community leader, oral historian and philosopher – affectionately known as 'Black Thought' and is famous for his knowledge about any and every subject imaginable, particularly the Black Diaspora. This 98 year wise scholar was a pioneer in the independent, progressive black political movement in Chicago which eventually tsaw the rise of Chicago's first Black Mayor, the late honorable Mayor Harold Washington. Professor Black is also credited with coining the phrase "plantationpolitics." Dr. Black's celebrated book, Bridges of Memory: Chicago's First Wave of Great Migration, chronicles black Chicago history from the 1920s to the present, and is based on interviews he conducted with local luminaries and every day individuals whose stories are

deeply interwoven into the fabric of Chicago's past, present and future.

In light of his excellence, the Soulful Chicago Book Fair conducts an essay contest named for Timuel D. Black, awarding Chicago elementary and high school youth, who compose compelling essays about the history of Chicago, and the roles their familites played in its evolution.

## **NEW AUTHOR TRIBUTE CEREMONY**

It takes courage and perseverance to author a book. For this reason, the Soulful Chicago Book Fair acknowledges new authors with awards of recognition for their strong work.





## LITTLE FREE LIBRARY

Bolstering literacy in our community cannot end when the show is over! To keep the drive towards high literacy alive, the Soulful Chicago Book Fair has begun its installation of Free Little Libraries around the south side of Chicago. These adorable little book homes allow the community to take a book, free of charge, and put in a book that someone else may want to read. In partnership with the youth organization Metro Squash, our first Little Free Library has been installed on 61st Street and Cottage Grove, just a block away from where the actual event was held. Our first library has been wiped clean, with us having to fully replenish it within its first 2 weeks in existence.

## **SCBF MONTHLY EVENTS**

The Soulful Chicago Book Fair builds up to its main event with a series of monthly events that focus on literary development and networking for writers. Past events have included *Microphone Check*, a spoken word affair, *Black Authors Unite*, for author connecting and training and *So You Want to Publish a Book* for emerging writers. The Soulful Chicago partnered with community organizations, creating events that enhanced author performance, skill and camaraderie leading up to and at the main event.
