The Architectonics of Music

Iannis Xenakis: Scale

(Studio in 3 Parts)

Part 1. Music /Architecture

The studio begins with experimental models working with materials, light and time. In this 6 week exercise, until Midterm, students will be challenged to make a physical model according to a piece of music by composer lannis Xenakis.

Part 2. Site/ Research

Patra is the third largest city in Greece. It is located on the northern side of Peloponnese and its port is considered the gateway of Greece to Europe. The site is positioned between the <u>marina (Links to an external site.)</u> and <u>harborside (Links to an external site.)</u>. The students will analyze the site in conjunction with the urban development of the city during the Kinne trip in Greece.

Part 3. Center for Contemporary Music Research

A 2,000 m² new facility will be designed to house the Center for Contemporary Music Research, which was originally established by the composer lannis Xenakis in 1979. This new facility will reenergize the role of the foundation within the cultural life of Greece and support multi-disciplinary research on the cultural, social and scientific aspects of musical expression.
