Ken Lustbader '93 MSHP is a co-director of the NYC LGBT Historic Sites Project, the first cultural heritage initiative and educational resource to document historic sites connected to the LGBT community in New York City. For over 30 years, he has been exploring issues related to LGBT history, documentation, and historic preservation. More recently, he co-authored the "LGBT History Tour, Greenwich Village, NYC" walking tour brochure and map, which highlights LGBT historic sites around Stonewall National Monument, and guest-edited issue 8.2 LGBTQ Heritage (2019) for Change Over Time: An International Journal of Conservation and the Built Environment.
