STEPHEN BURKS IN CONVERSATION WITH AMALE ANDRAOS

September 14, 6pm Virtual Lecture

Burks, founder of Stephen Burks Man Made, is one of the most recognized American industrial designers of his generation. Burks is a recipient of the IIT Alumni Professional Achievement Award, the Brooklyn Museum Modernism Young Designer Award, the A&W, Architektur & Wohnen Audi Mentor Prize and the United States Artists Architecture & Design Target Fellowship Grant, as well as being the first African-American to win the Smithsonian Cooper Hewitt National Design Award in Product Design.



ROBERT GOODSPEED September 15, 1pm Virtual Lecture

Goodspeed is Assistant Professor of Urban Planning at Taubman College at the University of Michigan. Drawing on his recent book, Scenario Planning for Cities and Regions, Goodspeed will highlight innovative examples of professional practice, touch on related research on urban informatics and planning support systems, and propose new ways scenario planning can be applied to current issues such as pandemic response, evictions, mobility transitions, and climate change.

DEBRA LAEFER

September 17, 6:30pm Virtual Lecture

Laefer is a Professor of Urban Informatics at NYU's Center for Urban Science and the Department of Civil and Urban Engineering. This talk will cover aerial remote sensing platforms and advances in laser scanning and hyperspectral imagery. Laefer will also reflect on lessons learned on equipment limitations and processing challenges; where the industry is likely to be in 5 years from a technology perspective; and the role of such technologies amidst the current debate on public monuments.
